PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTES

I wrote *Prairie Nurse* in 2013 as a partly-true but mostly fiction comedy inspired by my mother's first months in Canada. It has been called an immigration story something that I always felt was misleading or incomplete.

An immigration story is not finite. It is a beginning. It is the How We Got Here. I like to think that the true story of immigration is sewn over generations: The We Are Here. Now What?

In the summer of 2018, my mother and I traveled to Rosthern, Saskatchewan to see a lovely production of *Prairie Nurse* at The Station Arts Centre. It was extra special because it felt like a kind of homecoming: Rosthern is just two hours away from Arborfield, SK where my mother spent her first two years in Canada and the setting of *Prairie Nurse*.

At intermission, I went outside and marveled at that prairie sky at dusk. Her beauty, her romance, and all her possibilities. It struck me that under that sky was the next chapter of this *Prairie Nurse* story: The Now What?

Maraming Salamat to Gil Garratt, The Blyth Festival, Nina Lee Aquino and The Factory Theatre for saying yes to this dance. Thank you to all the incredible creatives, designers, technicians and behind-the-scenes cheerleaders - you are magic makers. And lastly, so much love to Ericka and Tony for two-stepping into these characters who have lived in my dreams for years.

The Waltz is my coming-of-age-love letter to the Saskatchewan Sky, growing up second gen in the 90s and a sequel to *Prairie Nurse*.

This one is for my brother. He would have loved it.

MEET THE PLAYWRIGHT



Marie Beath Badian is an award-winning, Filipino-Canadian writer and playwright based in T'karonto [Toronto, Ontario, Canada].

Her plays *Prairie Nurse* and *The Waltz* are part of a multi-generational trilogy spanning fifty years, set in rural Saskatchewan. The third play, *The Cottage Guest*, is in development. All three are commissions of The Blyth Festival.

Marie Beath is a two-time alumnus of The

Banff Playwrights Lab. Her commissions include Prairie Theatre Exchange, The Blyth Festival, Young People's Theatre and The Stratford Festival. She developed work in the playwright units of Cahoots Theatre Company, Tarragon Theatre, Soulpepper Playwrights Circle and The Factory Theatre. She was the Playwright-in-Residence at fu-GEN Asian-Canadian Theatre Company, Project: Humanity and The Blyth Festival.

She is the 2022 Recipient of The Playwright Guild of Canada's Tom Hendry Award for New Drama and a 2023 Honourable Mention for the Herman Voaden Prize for her play *Common: A Trilogy.* She was co-nominated along with Romeo Candido for a 2022 Canadian Screen Award for Best Writing/Web-series for the CBC Gem Series *Topline*.

Her work is published by Playwrights' Canada Press and Scirocco Drama.



With a string of firsts in Asian Canadian theatre, Nina was the founding Artistic Director of fu-GEN Asian Canadian theatre company, organized the first Asian Canadian theatre conference, edited the first (2-volume) Asian Canadian play anthology, and co-edited the first (award-winning) book on Asian Canadian theatre. She was previously the Artistic Director of Cahoots Theatre and Factory Theatre and is now the Artistic Director of English Theatre at the National Arts

Centre. Awards for her work include the Ken McDougall Award, the Canada Council John Hirsch Prize, the Toronto Arts Foundation's Margo Bindhart and Rita Davies Cultural Leadership Award, the Toronto Theatre Critics Award for Best Director, and three Dora Mavor Moore Awards for Outstanding Direction.

Jackie Chau Set and Costume Designer

Jackie has worked as a set and costume designer for over 200 productions and her work can been seen across Canada and internationally. Jackie was named in NOW Magazine's Top 10 Theatre Artists of 2009, nominated for the Virginia and Myrtle Cooper Award in Costume Design, nominated for a Saskatoon Area Theatre (SAT) award, Winnipeg Theatre Award, two Broadway World awards and has received eight Dora nominations for outstanding set and costume design. She is also teaching Theatrical Design at the University of Toronto.

Michelle is an award-winning lighting designer for dance, theatre, and opera. 
