I love this play. I really, really love it.

Why? Where do I start?

Frances's imagination. The scope and scale of imagination on display in this work is astonishing. Frances has built an entire world to complement and comment on our own. It is at once deeply detailed and intricate and also profoundly accessible. The story takes place in a world and time that we can recognize as our own, but that is also set in a future we can't yet see.

Someone once asked me to describe the themes of the play when Frances was first writing it and I remember saying, "Well, identity, social media influence, the climate crisis, colonization, feminism, friendship, hope..." and then I started to laugh. I laughed for two reasons. The first was because I was awestruck by how this simple story, this space-tale, was able to hold so beautifully all these themes all at once. The second reason I started to laugh was because of how I finished the list, "... and it's HILARIOUS."

This is another main reason I love this play. It's funny. It's so funny! Whimsical, irreverent, satirical, and true. The process of watching this play take shape from draft to draft has been pure joy.

And what a joy it was to share this play with live audiences last season as part of our 50th anniversary.

Now, in a new season, we are thrilled to offer the production in a new way: a digital production. Digital theatre has been a way for PTE to share stories across geographies, to make the theatre we produce accessible in ways we've never been able to explore before. Since 2020, we've produced or presented 14 works on digital platforms, playing to audiences across this country and around the globe. We are elated that *Space Girl* is the next production we're able to add to our digital offerings.

So, whether you're watching this production at home on your tv/laptop/pad, on your phone as you travel, or on any device or location in between, thank you for engaging with this world premiere of Frances' story. It's really out of this world!

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Space Girl concerns itself with our relationship to spaces (whether it be cyberspace, outer space or the space we take up on the earth's land & waters) and it examines how we live in it and how we share it.

This show has been one of the best collaborative spaces I have ever created in. I can safely say that we tipped hierarchy on its head and created a circle of space where everyone was empowered to make offers and contribute to the building of Frances's fantastical world. It has been heart-opening, joyous and exhilarating, and I am forever grateful to Frances, PTE, as well as to everyone who has contributed their artistry, creativity and wisdom to the birth of this new Manitoban play.

Frances's adventure story is an absolutely wild, hilarious and uncompromising ride. Lyra, along with the malevolent and benevolent forces she encounters, all have their own access to space. On the first day of rehearsal, I asked Brynn, Justin and Daina to answer these 4 questions about each of their characters:

What spaces do you have access to? How did you gain that access?

What power do those spaces grant you? How do you use/share that power?

As we share Lyra's journey in this theatre space, I welcome you to ask those questions in relation to your own life. And to perhaps ponder the collective responsibility we have to one another to create a space where we can all grow and thrive together.

FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

I have always believed that the great tragedies and comedies of our time would play out on social media.

That belief was strengthened by the comfort and connection I found on social media during the COVID-19 pandemic, including but not limited to Moments such as: "Tiger King", Harry Styles's attempt at an acting career, and my own personal discovery of a newfound passion for sci-fi and western movies.

But my #1 Moment occurred not long after Kim Kardashian finalized her divorce from Kanye West. Her rebound - as I'm sure we all remember - was none other than former Saturday Night Live star and professional rebound boyfriend Pete Davidson.

But that wasn't the weird part - I mean, it was weird, but I get it, Pete's funny. What was really weird was that in the wake of this tragic dissolution of a problematic yet iconic couple, a space race began.

When the extremely credible gossip Instagrammer "Deux Moi" reported that Kanye West was spotted visiting his friend Elon Musk at SpaceX, I think we could all see what was coming. And sure enough, it wasn't long until Pete Davidson was spotted with Jeff Bezos. "Deux Moi", against all odds and its own historical track record, was right: Bezos and Musk were in a space race... and so too were Davidson and West.

Ultimately, none of these men went to space. But the absurdity of it all really stuck with me. I mean, the environment was dying, wars were waging, people were starving, and pandemics were raging. But, for the wealthy elite, none of that seemed to matter. There seemed to be no question about how to save the planet, only questions about how to colonize a new one.

And that was all kind of cringe.

And I thought someone should write a play about it.

Lyra


