DIRECTOR'S NOTES

When Thomas Morgan Jones and I discussed creating a new mystery play, I was overjoyed. He and I have, at our cores, a passion for both new Canadian works and the mythologizing of Canadiana. We thought, 'hey, let's invent a new worldrenowned hero detective'. Lucia Dante was born. We also were keenly aware of the world today, as the digital universe seems more and more to be merging, blending, and blurring with our own. Even from the time we began writing this play, the questions around AI and VR life have already advanced, beyond the state we were seeing at the time. So, this play seems to speak to a certain universal oeuvre as well.

There is also the power of intrigue and mystery theatre. As Canada's preeminent theatre for the mystery and intrigue, genre is our focus at Vertigo. What feels most exciting about genre theatre that people seem to connect with, is not only our obsessions with true crime, not only our amazement at human behaviours so contrary to our own, but the JUSTICE we know we will witness and get from coming to a play like that. In a world that seems often devoid of justice, here, audiences can get it, while also being entertained through a highly theatrical and exhilarating experience. We, at Vertigo, are so proud to be partnering with PTE on this world premiere of this new mystery and now, finally, we are so very proud to share it with you.
