RELAXED PERFORMANCE CONTENT & SENSORY WARNINGS

Note:

This play features five actors who each play multiple roles — nine characters in total. The story takes place in a small-town funeral home where a dysfunctional family gathers for what appears to be a somber occasion. The setting remains the same throughout, with changes in lighting and sound to support the action, and the actors make multiple quick costume changes as they transform between characters.

Liars at a Funeral is a sharp, fast-paced comedy about secrets, lies, and the tangled lengths families will go to for love and connection.

Content Warning:

This play takes place in a funeral home and includes talk of death, cancer, and heart attacks. There is talk of alcohol, Feigning heterosexuality, panic attacks, sex, and "shock therapy" is used as a metaphor. The play also includes profanity.

Sensory Warning:

When you enter the theatre sounds of rain and thunder will play. The stage is brightly lit. At times loud music will play, the lights will flicker and turn off, occasional bangs and the actors will yelp/yell in surprise. The actors use flashlights which may shine in the audiences' eyes.
